### WHEN IS THE DEADLINE TO SUBMIT THE REGISTRATION FORM?

The deadline for applications is **23:45 GMT on Friday 23 January 2026**.

### WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I SUBMIT THE REGISTRATION FORM?

Once the registration deadline has passed, a member of our team will contact you **by Friday 6 February** to let you know whether your application has been successful. If selected, we will also provide you with further details about the programme, including an overview of its structure, topics and guest speakers for the educational sessions, as well as the schedule for in-person events.

### WHAT WILL THE PROGRAMME INCLUDE?

The programme offers the following:

- **At least five online interactive training sessions**, covering a range of topics essential to indies in the games industry.
- **Guaranteed attendance at our annual breakfast seminar** on 26 February 2026, held at our London offices, with the opportunity to network with other studios and publishers in the games industry.
- **A summer games mixer**, offering further opportunities to connect with industry professionals and fellow members of the Collective.
- **Access to a set of template agreements** covering some of the basics often needed by indie studios in the early stages.
- **Access to a free legal helpdesk**, from February 2026 to February 2027, providing ad hoc legal support from our games lawyers.

### WHAT IS THE EXPECTED TIME COMMITMENT FOR THE PROGRAMME?

The core part of the programme will run for **six months**, starting in February 2026 and concluding in August 2026, and the legal helpdesk will be available for a full **twelve months** (February 2026 to February 2027). The time commitment includes attending several online sessions and participating in in-person events where possible. Please see the details in the previous question for further information.

## WHERE IS THE PROGRAMME BASED?

The programme includes both online and in-person events:

- The **training sessions** will take place online, so you can participate from anywhere.
- The **in-person events**, such as the Breakfast Briefing and the Summer Games Mixer will be held at our offices or another venue in central **London**.

## ARE THERE ANY RESTRICTIONS ON ELIGIBILITY?

You must be **18 years or older**, acting in a business capacity and not the subject of any sanctions.

There are no restrictions on geographical location. The training sessions and helpdesk services can be accessed online. However, please note that the in-person events will be held in London.

The programme will focus primarily on English and EU-level legal and business issues, as that is our area of expertise, but will also contain some material of general applicability to setting up and running an indie game studio in any country.

You will get the most out of this programme if you are planning to operate your business in whole or in part from the UK, but non-UK games businesses are not precluded from applying.

## ARE THERE ANY COSTS OR FEES?

Participation in the programme is **free of charge**.

If you decide to separately instruct us on a piece of work (for example, to incorporate a new company, draft a bespoke contract, or register a trade mark) there would be costs associated with that, which we would explain and agree with you in advance.

## WILL I NEED TO COVER ANY EXPENSES TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAMME?

You will need to cover your own **travel, accommodation, and other expenses** associated with your participation, if any.

## WHEN WILL I FIND OUT IF MY APPLICATION IS SUCCESSFUL?

We will inform all applicants of the outcome of their registration by **Friday 6 February 2026**.

## WILL I HAVE ACCESS TO ONGOING SUPPORT OR RESOURCES ONCE THE PROGRAMME IS OVER?

You will retain access to all the materials provided to you during the programme. The free helpdesk period will end in February 2027, but we will be available to provide ongoing paid support and advice if needed.
